October 1 is the beginning of the new federal grant-making year. Several federal agencies (i.e., SAMHSA, HRSA, CDC) have started releasing their forecasts for when grant requests for proposals will be released. Typically, when federal funding opportunities are released, there are only 4-8 weeks from the time of the release of the Funding Opportunity to the deadline for application submission.

In this webinar, grantsmanship expert Dr. Rhonda Bohs breaks down the steps necessary to be "grant ready" as a potential federal grantee; Dr. Bohs will focus on identifying funding opportunities prior to their formal NOFA/FOA release to conduct strong pre-planning and application design; Dr. Bohs will also walk through common elements of success and pitfalls of federal grant applications.

If you are new or relatively new to grant seeking, applying for federal grants, or are looking to fine-tune your federal grant-seeking process to determine which aspects you can improve to increase your success percentage of funded grant applications, this webinar is for you!

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**Rhonda Bohs, Ph.D.**, has over 30 years of experience working in the behavioral health field. As an academically trained



researcher, Dr. Bohs identified early in her career that if she was to conduct research and program evaluations in communitybased programs, she needed to become an expert in grant writing. Since then, Dr. Bohs has successfully written and/or managed more than 300 grant programs from SAMHSA (CSAT, CSAP, and CMHS), HRSA, CDC, ACF, Bureau of Justice, Corrections, and state and local grant proposals. In the past 10 years, Dr. Bohs has worked with organizations in receiving more than \$500 million in grant funding.

In her spare time, Dr. Bohs conducts research and program evaluation programs including serving as the lead evaluator for multiple SAMHSA-funded initiatives. Additionally, Dr. Bohs has served as Site Investigator for activities in the NIDA Clinical Trials Network and as Co-Principal Investigator on a P20 Research Center grant in collaboration with Florida International University and funded through the National Center on Minority Health Disparities.
